We like the use of Class Dojo for communicating with parents, the 'stories' are a great link to the classroom learning, and the ability to message the teachers via Dojo is useful. Please can you carefully consider whether displaying the 'slimming world' banner on the front gates of the school is appropriate? I don't think the message is in line with the body positive approach taught to the children in school. I don't want my children reading it and thinking that 'slimming' and diet culture is something they should aspire to. Children won't distinguish that the banner is from an outside organisation. Hosting the meetings in school is not an issue but displaying the banner in such a prominent position I think is damaging for children, especially the older year groups who are becoming more body conscious.

I think communication about progress isn't regular enough. It would be good to use online tools to give more regular updates
